Harley and a business partner owned the building on Valley Drive that was home to Ivy Tech Community College. With some creative planning, the building was put into a Charitable Remainder Trust naming the Foundation as the beneficiary. After eight years, the Foundation would own the building. By the end of the trust, Ivy Tech was constructing a new campus and the building was sold and the proceeds placed into an endowment fund to support Ivy Tech...*forever*.

Coming from simple beginnings, the Snyders met at Valparaiso High School. Upon returning from the Army, Harley joined his father in his real estate and insurance business. Jan attended Valparaiso University and went on to be a kindergarten teacher at Valparaiso Community Schools. As Harley's business grew, he made time to get involved in the community and Jan volunteered with her favorite charities.

The Snyders continue to be interested in the long-term future of Porter County. "We follow the philosophy that to whom much is given, much is required. We are grateful for our blessings and want to share our good fortune—not just financially—through time and talents as well." In addition to their original gift, the Snyders have established named endowment funds in memory of their parents—one benefitting the Boys & Girls Clubs of Greater Northwest Indiana and the other benefitting Opportunity Enterprises. Because Harley and Jan were thoughtful in their planning, their love for our community will last forever.
